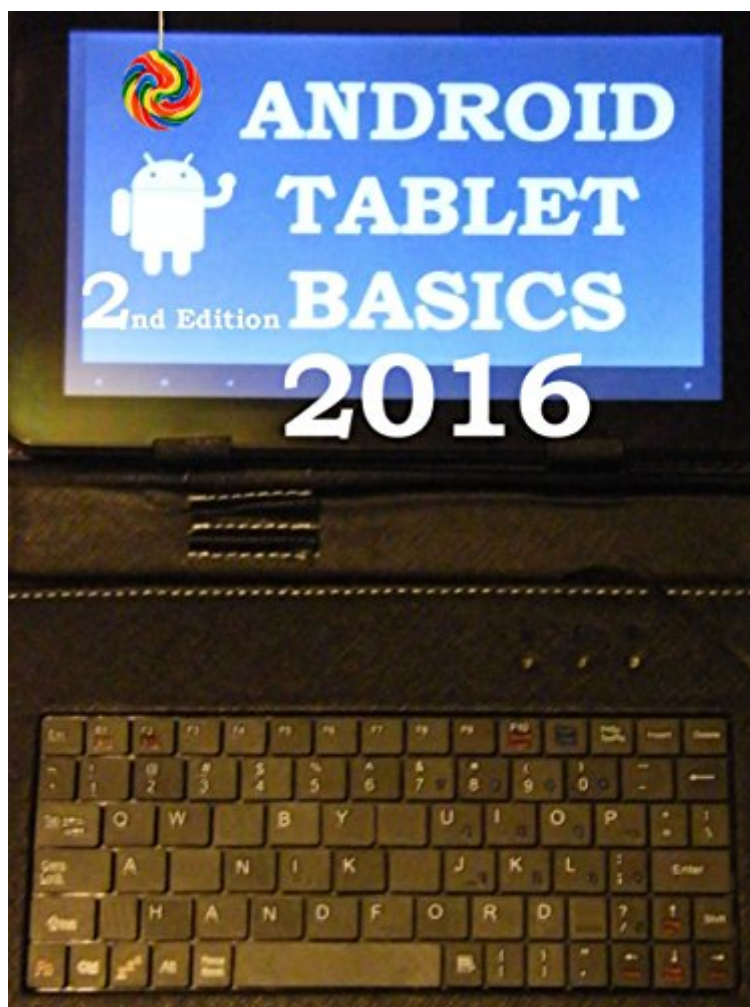

We have also increased most of the image sizes so it's clearer on HD devices. Once you buy the book the updates are free. This book assumes you know nothing about Tablets. If you have one and know everything, it's not for you. It contains the basics and explains: How to start using your Tablet. What the Icons mean. How to get Apps. How and where to change settings. How to browse pages on your Memory on the USB or MicroSD cards. How to access the extended Virtual Keyboard functions. How to capture screen images. How to use File Manager. How to add/edit Screens and Folders. External Keyboard Ctrl key Commands. Creating Apps (easier than you might think). Factory Reset (when the button won't work). And much more. Recently we've added the more differences for Phones, Galaxy Tab and Hudl2, More Definitions and explanations of sockets. Each update is sent out free this is the (Feb 2016) 12th edition since its original release. Including the wake-up for Hudl2s which seem to have died. The changes Lollipop has brought and how to fix many of the problems. One word of warning if you have a Kindle Fire this is not the book for you, it uses Fire OS which is or was based on Android but they are not the same.

Too bad the author didn't use a recent tablet to take the pictures.Save your money.Instead, I would recommend "Samsung Galaxy Tabs for Dummies" by Dan Gookin is a much more engaging book that covers more features more completely and is a handy reference, even if you're not a "dummy."
